





Executive Summary

At this time, TSCL and Solace Global advises against all travel to China, Daegu in South Korea and Iran due to the ongoing travel restrictions, cancelled flights, government warnings and outbreak of COVID-19. Additionally, we advise against all non-essential travel to Hong Kong, Macau, Cheongdo in South Korea and 11 towns in northern Italy. Further travel restrictions and disruption to business operations globally are possible in the coming days and weeks.

Latest Updates

The Governor of California, Gavin Newsom announced that the *Grand Princess* cruise ship will be delayed from entering San Francisco due to the COVID-19 virus. This follows an announcement that one former passenger had died as a result of the virus and another has been tested positive for the symptoms whilst travelling between San Francisco and Mexico. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention has advised passengers to remain in their rooms while screening tests are carried out. The ship was due to travel to Hawaii and Mexico however was recalled to San Francisco when the fatality was confirmed. A state of emergency has also been declared after it was announced that there were 53 confirmed cases and a fatality in the state.

Though the number of confirmed cases in mainland China has surpassed the 80,000 figure and now stands 80,430, over the last 24 hours there were only 139 new cases, of which 134 were in Hubei. There were also 31 fatalities, all in Hubei, bringing the total number of fatalities in the country to 3,012. This represents a significant slowdown in the country, with officials looking to reverse the travel restrictions, to ensure those from countries currently experiencing outbreaks, as well as evacuating citizens from Iran.

Saudi Arabia has expanded its restrictions on those intending to take part in a pilgrimage in the country to Saudi nationals as well as foreign travellers. The government stated that this was only a temporary measure; however, no end date has currently been given. Elsewhere, Slovenia and Hungary have confirmed their first cases. The Australian government has expanded its travel ban to individuals travelling from South Koreas. Prime Minister Scott Morrison announced that the ban would allow border force officials to implement greater screening protocols as further enhanced measures are due to be announced at airports.
